TASKS:

- Print yourself a copy of the current EYFS we WILL refer to this throughout the course. Put it in your folder.
- Print the UNCRC summary sheet available to download on the website listed above. You can also look at the full document, but you need to understand the summary. Put it in your folder.

- Who is Baby P and what happened to him?

2. Theoretical Approaches

TASKS:

Choose a theorist from the list above, research:

- who they are
- why they are known in the education world
- what are their approaches to children's development and learning styles?

Print out your information and put it in your folder, under divider titled UNIT 1.

3. Work Placement

You will have to complete 50 hours of placement over the 2-year course. This is organised by yourself. You are expected to go from October time during your study periods. It is best to try and get into a nursery and try out all age groups in there. You will need to get your time slots signed off from a member of the nursery staff.

TASKS:

- Research local nurseries, pre-schools, and primary schools with school nursery classes.
- Write yourself a list of possibilities that you could get to and like the sound of.
- Prepare a draft email or letter to send. Explain that you are a student at Rushden Academy completing the BTEC in Children's Play, Learning and Development and you need to complete placement hours with children aged 0-7 years and 11 months. (Once you know your timetable you might have a morning or afternoon a week you could do or your work experience week at the end of year 12)
- Print a copy of your research and email or letter and put it in your folder to show me in September.
