## Survey link

As ever it has been a busy couple of weeks at Huxlow. We are very excited that a group of Year 7 students are currently working on a project with Northampton Saints and our Aspire Higher team through the University of Northampton. This programme is aimed to help to improve their writing skills through improving their coordination. The programme will run for 5 weeks. Each week is broken down into a core skill that lends itself to various sporting activities, as well as being integral for writing. Students will explore how each skill can be used to make the link between the skill and writing.

On Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April, students in Year 7 took part in the first Take your Child to Work Day. 70 students participated in the event, with photos and reflections of students and their experiences being sent in. These ranged from digital media experiences to veterinary experiences, working outdoors to working in offices. These invaluable experiences allow for students to begin to think about their own future career pathways and destinations. For those who were unable to secure a work placement, virtual work experience was undertaken, either at a park, airport or in a hospital and students could learn about different positions and careers within these fields. As well as this, some students took part in an Enterprise challenge with the Talent Foundry, planning for and designing a music festival. Alongside this, some students took part in a transferable skills workshop with Aspire Higher and the University of Northampton.





Year 11 and 13 are rapidly heading to the start of the formal examination period. Indeed, some Year 11 students have spent two days completing their Art exam and nearly all of Year 11 have also completed their French Speaking assessments already. They have performed admirably in these assessments and the French team are rightly very proud that the year group are off to such a positive start. I popped in briefly to the art exam after day one and the quality of the work being produced was exceptional. This strong start can only build the students confidence as they work hard in the final leg of their preparations. Staff are making many opportunities available right up to the exams and students are really encouraged to make sure they are utilising these as fully as possible by attending every lesson and joining extra sessions during lunches and after school.

We are all looking forward to the upcoming extended bank holiday weekend and I hope that you are able to enjoy it together. Going forwards as part of the handover, Mrs Isaksen will be communicating with you to let you know of her plans for after the half term break. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many parents/carers who have contacted me to wish me well in my new post and recognise the work that we have undertaken to improve Huxlow over the last three years. It has been a privilege to work with all of our students and see them grow both academically and as young people. They truly are a pleasure to work with every day and they bring an energy and sense of enjoyment to our school. I would also like to thank all of our staff for their support, commitment and hard work. They work so hard and care so deeply about your children and at times this can feel like it is with little recognition and thanks.
